## Mae grantiau ar gael i helpu teuluoedd ar incwm isel brynu gwisg ysgol a chyfarpar

Gall plant sy'n derbyn a dysgwyr sy'n cael prydau ysgol am ddim derbyn grant gan Lywodraeth Cymru os ydynt:

- yn mynd i mewn dosbarth derbyn mewn ysgol gynradd
- ar ddechrau unrhyw gyfnod allweddol 2, 3 a 4 (cynradd ac uwchradd)
- yn 4, 7, 11 neu 14 oed mewn ysgolion arbennig, canolfannau adnoddau anghenion arbennig neu unedau cyfeirio disgyblion

Bydd plant ysgolion cynradd ac uwchradd â'r hawl i £125 ar gyfer pob cais. Gall plant sy'n dechrau blwyddyn 7 bellach wneud cais am £200 i helpu gyda chostau ychwanegol dechrau yn yr ysgol uwchradd.

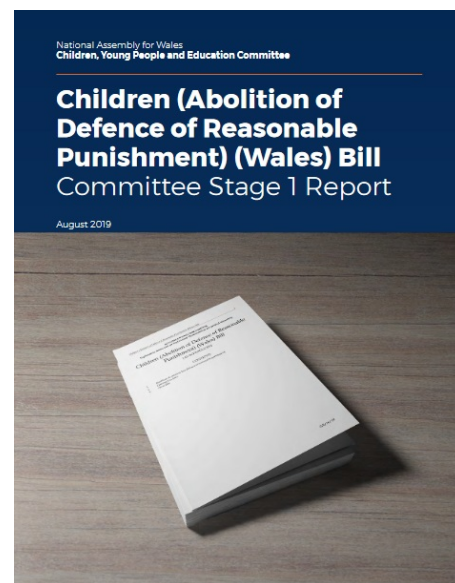

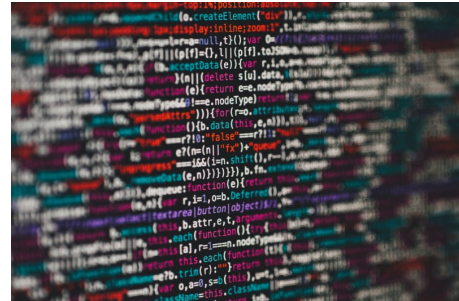

Mae'n gosod pedwar ar ddeg safon o ddyluniadau oed priodol ac yn gosod budd y plentyn fel y brif ystyriaeth wrth ddylunio a datblygu gwasanaethau ar-lein.

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### **Grants available to help families on low incomes buy school uniform and equipment**

Looked after children and learners receiving free school meals can get a Welsh Government grant if they are:

- entering reception class in primary school
- at the start of any of the Key Stage 2, 3 and 4 (primary and secondary)
- aged 4, 7, 11 or 14 in special schools, special needs resource bases or pupil referral units

Primary and Secondary school children are entitled to £125 for each application.

Children entering Year 7 can now apply for £200 to help with the additional costs of starting secondary school.

The fund will cover school uniform and sports kit, equipment for out of school hours trips, including outdoor learning, and equipment for activities within the curriculum, such as design and technology.

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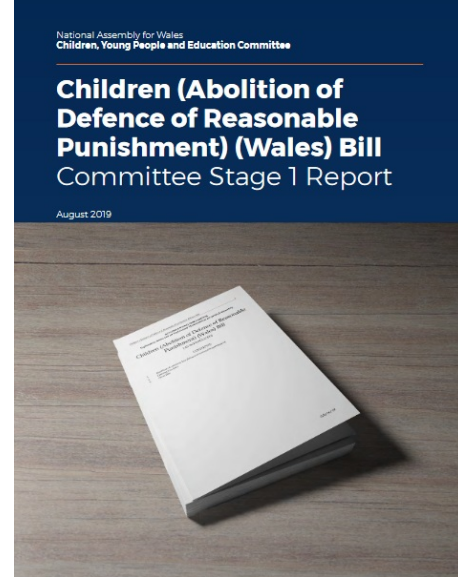
## **Children, Young People and Education Committee: Abolition of Defence of Reasonable Punishment Bill Stage 1 report**

The Children, Young People and Education Committee at the National Assembly for Wales has published their [Stage 1 report on the Children \(Abolition of Defence of Reasonable Punishment\) \(Wales\) Bill](#).

After examining the principles of the Bill and collecting evidence through consultation, the Committee has produced a number of recommendations on the Bill.

The Committee provided twenty recommendations, agreeing the general principles, and also calling for the Welsh Government to ensure that parents were adequately supported and informed of the changes made by the Bill.

As the final part of its Stage 1 scrutiny, the Bill will be [debated in Plenary on the 17<sup>th</sup> September 2019](#).

## ***Climate Change, Environment and Rural Affairs Committee: Fuel Poverty Inquiry***

The National Assembly for Wales Climate Change, Environment and Rural Affairs Committee has opened a consultation on fuel poverty in Wales.

The Committee says that the Welsh Government had a statutory obligation to stop fuel poverty in Wales by 2018. The Committee's inquiry will examine how and where fuel poverty is affecting Wales, why the Welsh Government failed to meet its target, and how much the current action has helped, among other things.

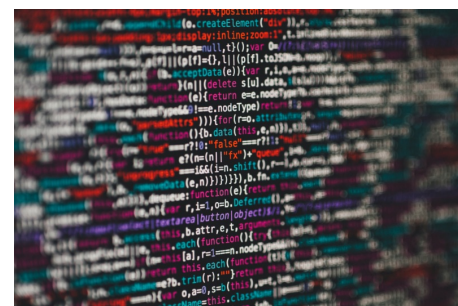

## ***Information Commissioner's code for protecting children online***

The Information Commissioner has written an update about the progress of the Information Commissioner's Office's (ICO) code to keep people safe online.

The code, [Age appropriate design: a code of practice for online services](#), was opened for consultation in April, and will be presented to the UK Government on 23 November 2019.

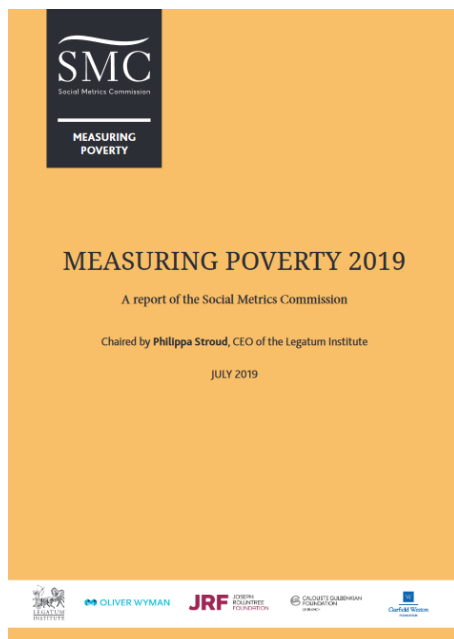


The [original consultation](#) said that the code is aimed at online services; things like "apps, connected toys, social media platforms, online games, education websites, and streaming services, when they process children's data." It sets out sixteen standards of age appropriate design and makes the best interests of the child a

primary consideration when designing and developing online services.

The Commissioner's update states that their aim is not to prevent young people engaging with the world around them, and instead of excluding them from the digital world, it will protect them while they use it.

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## **Social Metrics Commission Report 2019**

The Social Metrics Commission has published a report examining the 'extent and nature of poverty in the UK today'. Its analysis shows how poverty has changed from 2000/01 to now.

Amongst the key findings, [the report](#) shows that: 'There are 14.3 million people in poverty in UK,' including '8.3 million working-age adults; 4.6 million children; and 1.3 million pension-age adults.'

The report shows that over all rates of poverty haven't changed much since 2000/01 and that the biggest changes have been the rates of poverty among different groups. Poverty amongst children dropped initially then raised, from 31% in 2014/15 to 34% now.
