Mae [ymchwil newydd gan Brifysgol Caerdydd](#) yn dangos bod angen gwell cefnogaeth ar gyfer plant sydd mewn perygl o ddioddef ecsbloetio rhywiol (CSE).

Bu'r ymchwil yn edrych ar achosion grwp o bobl ifanc a fu'n ymwneud â gwasanaethau plant yn 2006. Cawsant eu hasesu o ran risg ecsbloetio rhywiol.

Ffactor arwyddocaol o ran cynyddu'r risg oedd symud plant o'u llety. Dangosodd yr ymchwil fod siawns uwch i bobl ifanc ddioddef ecsbloetio rhywiol yn ddiweddarach po fwyaf y caent eu symud. Po amlaf y câi person ifanc ei symud, uchaf oedd y tebygolrwydd o brofi camdriniaeth mewn perthnasoedd oedolaeth gynnar, bod mewn sefyllfa ansefydlog o ran ty, a bod yn ddi-waith neu allan o fyd addysg.

Y math mwyaf buddiol o gefnogaeth oedd bod ag oedolyn cefnogol yn eu bywyd, a

Adroddiad Blynyddol Dechrau'n Deg Ebrill 2018 - Mawrth 2019

Mae Llywodraeth Cymru wedi cyhoeddi Adroddiad Blynyddol Dechrau'n Deg ar gyfer y flwyddyn 2018 i 2019.

Mae'r adroddiad yn rhoi trosolwg ystadegol o waith y gwasanaeth rhwng Ebrill 2018 a Mawrth 2019.

Mae ystadegau allweddol yn nodi bod 36,367 wedi elwa o'r gwasanaeth yn ystod 18/19, nifer is na'r flwyddyn flaenorol, ond nifer oedd yn dal yn uwch

na'r disgwyl.

Manteisiwyd ar fwy o gynigion gofal plant mewn lleoliadau Dechrau'n Deg yn ystod y flwyddyn hon o gymharu â'r flwyddyn flaenorol, a gwelwyd cynnydd bychan yn nifer y plant oedd yn byw mewn ardaloedd Dechrau'n Deg oedd wedi cael imiwneiddiad llawn erbyn eu pen-blwydd yn bedair oed.

Gwelwyd rhywfaint yn llai o blant hyd at bedair oed gan ymwelwyr iechyd neu'r tîm iechyd ehangach nag yn y flwyddyn flaenorol, ac er bod cynnydd yn nifer y babanod 10 diwrnod oed oedd yn bwydo ar y fron ledled Cymru, roedd y nifer yn is mewn ardaloedd Dechrau'n Deg nag mewn ardaloedd eraill.

The impact of the Children's Rights (Wales) Measure 2011

The Children, Young People and Education Committee is undertaking a short inquiry into the impact of the Children's Rights (Wales) Measure 2011.

The Committee wants to examine how much of an effect the Measure has had on the Welsh Government's decision making. It also wants to examine whether or not the Measure has led to improved outcomes for children and young people in Wales, among other things.

The inquiry closes on **20 September 2019 at 17:00.**

'Keeping Safe?' Better support needed for children at risk of sexual exploitation

[New research from Cardiff University](#) shows that better support is needed for children at risk of sexual exploitation (CSE).

The research examined the cases of a group of young people who were involved with children's services in 2006. They were assessed for their risk of sexual exploitation.

A significant factor in increased risk was moving children from their accommodation. The research showed that the more a young person was moved, the higher their chances of becoming victims of CSE later. The more a young person was moved, the higher the likelihood that they would experience abuse in intimate early adulthood relationships, having an unstable housing situation and being unemployed or out of education.

The most beneficial type of support was to have a supportive adult in their life, with one to work the intervention that was most likely to help. Common responses to CSE, like healthy relationships education, did not have a positive impact for most young people, the report said, and sometimes made things worse.

Identifying health and well-being research priorities for children 0 -



7 years

Public Health Wales has produced a survey to help inform their research priorities over the next ten years.

The survey, aimed at professionals and non-professionals alike, aims to identify key areas that affect the health and well-being outcomes of children from during pregnancy to seven years

old.

Public Health Wales will use this information to identify gaps in their current knowledge on the best outcomes for this group of children. With the gaps identified, Public Health Wales will create a research agenda for the next 10 years which addresses the gaps.

Flying Start Annual Report April 2018 to March 2019

The Welsh Government has published the Flying Start Annual Report for the year 2018 to 2019.

The report supplies a statistical overview of the service's work from April 2018 to March 2019.

Key statistics note that 36,367 benefited from the service during 18/19, which was lower than the year before, but still higher than expected.

More offers of childcare at Flying Start settings were taken up this year compared with the year before, and there was a slight increase in the number of children living in Flying Start areas who were fully immunised by their fourth birthday.



Children up to the age of four were seen slightly less than the year before by health visitors or the wider health team, and while there was an increase in the numbers of babies at 10 days old breastfeeding across Wales, the number was lower in Flying Start areas than in non-Flying Start areas.

Education statistics from Welsh Government

A number of education statistics have been published recently by the Welsh Government. For more information, please see the individual release.

- [Academic achievement of pupils aged 4 to 14 in core subjects 2019](#): this release covers pupils' achievements in English, Welsh, Mathematics and Science. Compared to last year, the percentage of pupils achieving at least the expected level was lower. This could be because of changes to the way that teacher assessment data is collected.
- [National curriculum teacher assessments of the non-core subjects 2019](#): This release covers pupil achievements in Key Stage 2 and 3 in non-core subjects. The percentage of pupils achieving at least the expected results also fell in the non-core subjects. This could also be a result of changes to the way data is collected.
- [Pupils educated other than at school - September 2018 to August 2019](#): 2,286 pupils are being educated other than at school during this period and the rate of EOTAS increased to 3.8 per 1,000 pupils.
- [Schools' census results as at January 2019](#): Mainly because of school mergers, the number of local authority maintained schools dropped since January 2018. There were also less full-time equivalent qualified teachers since the same period.
