Lansio Gwneud Eich Marc 2019

Ar 23 Awst 2019, bydd Senedd Ieuencid y DU (UKYP) yn lansio eu pleidlais Gwneud Eich Marc i bobl ifanc ledled y DU. Yng Nghymru, hwylusir hyn gan fenter cyfranogiad, [Cymru](#)

[Ifanc](#), Plant yng Nghymru.

Bydd sefydliadau ledled Cymru yn derbyn eu pecyn adnoddau electronig brynhawn Gwener, gan eu galluogi i ddsbarthu'r papurau pleidleisio.

Mae'r bleidlais yn galluogi i bobl ifanc ddewis eu hymgyrchoedd cenedlaethol ar gyfer 2019, a phenderfynu beth yr hoffent ei drafod pan fydd yr UKYP yn cael eu trafodaeth flynyddol ym Mis Tachwedd yn Nhy'r Cyffredin.

Drwy fforymau a chynghorau ieuencid, sefydliadau ieuencid, ysgolion, colegau ac ar-lein, bydd y bleidlais yn rhoi cyfle i bobl ifanc gymryd rhan mewn democratiaeth, gan ddweud wrth eu Haelodau Senedd Ieuencid etholedig beth sy'n bwysig iddynt.

Y llynedd, cymerodd dros 1.1 miliwn o bobl ifanc ran yn y bleidlais ledled y DU, gyda'r nifer uchaf erioed o bleidleisiau yn cael eu bwrw yng Nghymru; 54,079.

Canlyniadau Safon Uwch gorau erioed yng Nghymru

Mae'r canlyniadau Safon Uwch dros dro yng Nghymru yn dangos bod Cymru wedi gwella ar y nifer o raddau A* i A nes cyrraedd y lefel uchaf erioed.



Bu cynnydd yn y graddau A* i A yng Nghymru o 26.3% yn 2018 i 27% eleni.

Mae Cymru hefyd wedi gwella o ran ei safle ar gyfer pob un o'r graddau. O'i gymharu â Lloegr a Gogledd Iwerddon, Cymru bellach sydd yn y safle cyntaf ar gyfer A*.

Fe wnaeth y Gweinidog Addysg, Kirsty Williams, AC, longyfarch myfyrwyr ledled Cymru ar eu canlyniadau, gan ddweud:

"Mae'n ddiwrnod mawr i bawb sy'n casglu eu canlyniadau Safon Uwch ac rwyf am longyfarch y myfyrwyr, ynghyd â'n hathrawon a'n staff gwych mewn ysgolion, am eu

holl waith caled hyd at heddiw."

Make Your Mark 2019 Launch

On 23 August 2019, the UK Youth Parliament (UKYP) will launch their Make Your Mark ballot for young people across the UK. In Wales, this is facilitated by Children in Wales' participation

initiative, [Young Wales](#).

Organisations throughout Wales will receive their electronic resources pack on Friday afternoon, allowing them to distribute the ballots.

The ballot allows young people to choose their national campaigns for 2019, and decide what they want to debate when the UKYP has their annual sitting in November at the House of Commons.

Through youth forums and councils, youth organisations, schools, colleges and online, the ballot will provide an opportunity for young people to participate in democracy, telling their elected Members of Youth Parliament what's important to them.

Last year, over 1.1 million young people took part in the ballot last year across the UK, with a record number of ballots returned in Wales; 54,079.

Record A-Level results in Wales

The provisional A-Level results in Wales show that Wales has improved the number of A* to A grades to a record high.

A* to A grades in Wales went from 26.3% in 2018 to 27% this year.

Wales has also made improvements in ranking for all grades. Compared to England and Northern Ireland are ranked first for A* grades.

The Minister for Education, Kirsty Williams AM, congratulated students across Wales on their results, saying:

"It's a big day for everyone collecting their A-level results and I want to congratulate the students, as well as our fantastic teachers and school staff, for all their hard work that's led up to today."

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National Assembly for Wales seeking new apprentices

The National Assembly for Wales is looking for new apprentices to work in the National Assembly offices in Cardiff Bay.

Successful applicants will study a Diploma in Business Administration for 12 months beginning in January 2020, and will work in a wide range of areas from the human resources team, to communication and engagement campaign, to security and building facilities departments.

The apprentices can expect to earn £17,383, which the National Assembly says is a living wage, and many previous apprentices have gone on to full time employment, some with the National Assembly.

Black History Wales Youth Awards (BHWYA) 2019

Nominations are now open for the Black History Wales Youth Awards 2019.

Young people from Black and Minority Ethnic communities in Wales, aged 13 to 30, can be nominated for awards in a variety of categories, including young leader, good citizen, science and innovation, young volunteer and young carer.

Each category has their own criteria, explaining what each category is for and how the young people can meet the entry requirements.

Advocacy standards and outcomes framework for children and young people

The Welsh Government has published guidance on the standards advocacy providers must meet when they provide advocacy for children and young people.

The [Independent Professional Advocacy: National Standards and Outcomes Framework for Children and Young People in Wales](#) set out what's required of advocacy providers during the delivery of their service.

The Framework sets out what outcomes children and young people can expect during advocacy. It sets out what standards the providers need to meet and to show that they are making a positive difference to children and young people's lives.

The standards include, amongst other things, easily accessible good quality independent advocacy, respect for children's privacy and confidences and having their wellbeing and safeguarding protected.

The Framework builds on and replaces the National Standards for the provision of Children's Advocacy Services (2003).
